H. NARRATIVE (attach additional pages as necessary)

1. Accomplishments:

In 2016, we had 15 SAR cases, one more than 2015. 15 persons were rescued. With our emphasis on education, we issued one citation and increased warnings to 284. We spot checked over 800 vessels and wrote 167 inspections. We again conducted our flare and night signaling demonstration and participated in multiple education programs. Activities and events increased on the Black River and schedule adjustments were made for availability. We participated with the Coast Guard, Watercraft and other marine partners in training for the RNC and terrorist events. Boat upgrades included additional lights, FLIR, and EPIRB.

2. Problems:

Grant funding was reduced by 8.5% in 2016. Yet the budget was pressured by increased Peace Officer training requirements, which are proposed to double in 2017. The Coast Guard has announced the reduction of Station Lorain to a 3 day a week Station Small in 2018. This may occur before the end of the 2017 season and will surely increase calls and demand. To keep the patrol boat in line with others, additional electronics such as Side Scan Sonar are needed.
