- LFL started in Wisconsin in 2009
- Co -Founders: Rick Brooks and Todd Bole
- Each library is handcrafted
- Books are for Children and adults
- They are located everywhere (bus stops, parks, country stores, lawns, day cares, schools...)
- LFL's hold between 20-100 books
- By the end of 2013 they expect to have 15,000 LFL's located in 55 countries
- General idea: "take a book, leave a book"

Lorain County Little Free Library Initiative

- 46 Little Free Libraries (30 LCJVS built ; 1 built by Kendal at Oberlin Woodshop; 2 Boys & Girls Clubs of Lorain County; 5 Invest Elyria; 2 Sydney Novak, South Amherst Girl Scout; 6 replica libraries to be built)
- 38 confirmed sites throughout Lorain County
- Collaboration with: Educational Service Center of Lorain County (fiscal agent), Lorain County JVS, local libraries, Elyria City Schools, Boys and Girls Clubs of Lorain County, Invest Elyria, Kendal Woodshop, and various non-profit organizations throughout the county.
- LCJVS Carpentry students building 30 Little Free Libraries
- LCJVS Carpentry students and the LCJVS NTHS (National Technical Honor Society) students will be working together to install 37 of the libraries
- 2,900 Pre-K to grade 6 books purchased (50 + books per library)
- Books bought through the Scholastic Books FACE program and First Book
- Charter Signs, Support Signs, and Steward packets will be provided for each LFL
- Chronicle Telegram providing FREE publicity for the Initiative
- Steward meetings held December 2013 – March 2014
- All Libraries should be operational by Spring 2014
