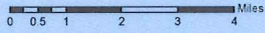

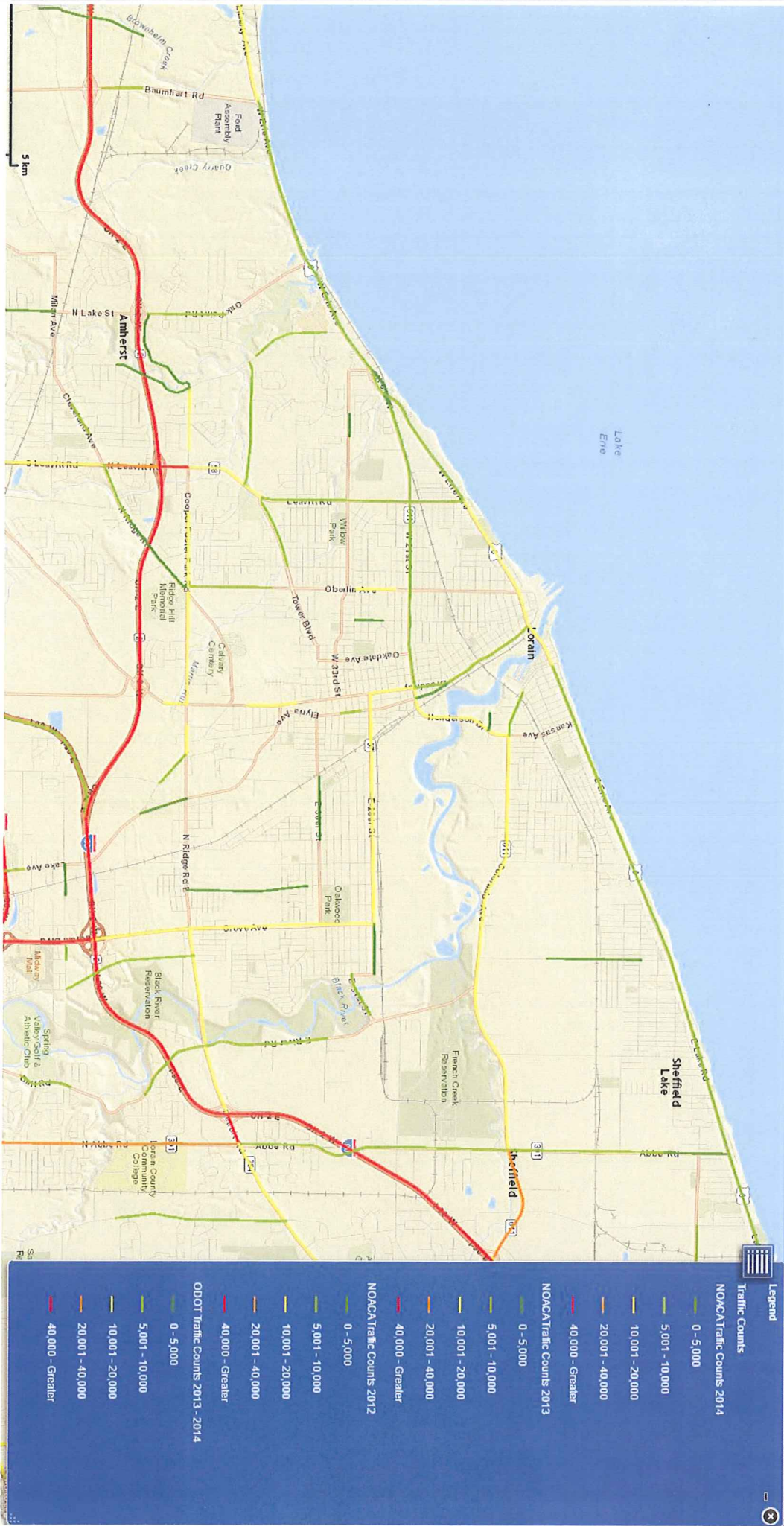

The Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (NOACA) is a public organization serving the counties of Cuyahoga, Franklin, Lorain and Medina (collectively known as the "Orange Triangle"). NOACA is the Agency designated for the special purposes of the following functions:

- Serve as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), with the responsibility for comprehensive, long-range and continuing planning for highways, public transit, and air quality, as defined in the current transportation law.
- Perform continuous water quality, transportation-related air quality, and other environmental planning functions.
- Administer the area air quality function, which includes providing fiscal support to the appropriate agencies to review a wide variety of local air quality applications for federal funds.
- Conduct transportation and environmental planning and related demographic, economic and land use research.
- Serve as an information center for transportation, environmental and related planning.
- At NOACA's discretion, provide transportation and environmental planning assistance to the 176 state of local, general purpose government.
